## VISITOR Multiplier Event in Greece

Held on December 5, 2022 at the Stratos Vasilikos Hotel in Athens and organised by IDEC and Hellenic Open University, the event successfully gathered 45 attendees, mainly consisting of secondary education teachers and professors, with some private sector attendees as well.



#### **Hands-on Workshop**

The event focused on the digital world and cultural heritage, demonstrating how the Visitor project tools can be used to present cultural heritage in classrooms. The event also included a workshop where participants could test the project's digital tools.

#### **UK Multiplier Event**

The UK multiplier event was held on February 13, 2023, at The Open University in Milton Keynes (England). The event saw 20 attendees from different fields, including school teachers, museum educators, academics, learning technologists, and XR specialists.

Participants were briefed on the project's aims and outcomes and engaged in group activities and discussions. The event concluded with ideas for further development and partnerships, as well as how VISITOR tools can be used in other contexts.

All partners agree that the VISITOR project resources could serve as a good base for other Erasmus+ projects in the future, or even the creation of VISITOR 2.0.
